A Walk on the South Side - from Cheltenham to The Suffolks


Delve into the historical legacy of one of Cheltenham's most charming suburbs - The Suffolks

Tour Information

Prepared by a local historian, this free self-guided walk explores The Suffolks, one of the early suburbs of Regency Cheltenham. Built around a handsome square, the area takes its name from the 15th Earl of Suffolk, owner of the estate until the 1820s.

Beginning at the Suffolk House flats, the circular route includes landmark buildings and touches upon their history. Taking about an hour, it uses the *PocketSights* app which you can download onto your smartphone. You can then take this tour at any time, at your own pace, and find other self-guided tours of Cheltenham and beyond.
